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PERIPHERAL ARTERIAL DISEASE SCREENING REPORT**Carotid Artery Test:**

The carotid arteries in your neck supply blood to your brain. If these arteries become blocked, a decrease in blood flow to your brain may result in a stroke.

Right carotid:

Normal - no evidence of blockage or plaque with normal blood flow. No follow up recommended.

Left carotid:

Normal - no evidence of blockage or plaque with normal blood flow. No follow up recommended.

Aorta Aneurysm Test:

The abdominal aorta is the largest artery in your abdomen. The walls of this artery can become thin and weak, causing the artery to swell. If the artery swells too much, it can rupture, causing death.

Normal - Less than or equal to 3 centimeters. No follow up recommended.

Arterial Test for Legs:

The arteries in your legs supply blood allowing you to walk. If these arteries become blocked, a decrease in blood flow to the legs may result in cramping, pain and the inability to walk long distances.

Right Leg:

Normal - 0.90 or higher. No follow up recommended.

Left Leg:

Normal - 0.90 or higher. No follow up recommended.
